Finally, pricing....

We haven't had a price increase on any products since March 2024, however since then we have seen a massive increase in overheads, especially gas and electricity, minimum wage, cellar gas, waste collection, and of course increased costs passed onto us from our suppliers. Despite these increases, Patrick and Charlotte have held a number of productive meetings with suppliers to try and ensure any increases are as low as possible. To put it into context Guiness are increasing their prices by 4.2% (the fourth year they have risen their prices by more than anyone in the industry) this may help you understand some of our decisions (which are also supply based) that we made earlier this year – we don't want to pass these increases onto you if possible!

Thanks to the loyalty of our members and these valuable meetings, we have been able to freeze the prices on a number of draught products and wines, this is unheard of in most premises! So, Carling and draught stout are frozen at 2024 prices for members!!

We also want to make it as attractive as possible for new members to join the club; to achieve this we have increased the difference between our member and non-members' drinks from 50p to £1, again allowing us to keep members' prices as low as possible.

Of course some increases are inevitable, whilst looking at prices we have also considered our range (we are to some extent limited with what we can supply as it is within the terms of our supplier agreement, from which we receive some additional benefits with the range we have on tap, such as financial support towards our TV package and festival backing) but we have also considered sales trends, seasonality and cost of products when mixing up our bar range.

In the coming weeks we are introducing a new session IPA, plus Thatcher Haze will return as a draught product. Whilst still available in bottles, we will lose draught Stowford and Staropramen to allow for this due to cellar capacity. We are also enhancing our non-alcoholic range with the introduction of zero-alcohol wines and a wider variety of zero alcohol spirits, lagers and ciders.

Our range of ales is commendable and, although there has to be a small increase, these will remain our lowest priced product per pint. Bring on the ale festival in 2 weeks' time!!

We will hold the current prices over the Easter weekend during which we also have extended opening hours. So, no increases will be seen until later in April as we always try our best to give you the best possible value and we hope you continue to come and support us!
